Clyde Linder Bane, Jr. died Saturday, December 23, 2017, age 92 years. Resident of Thrive at Brow Wood, Lookout Mountain, Georgia. Born in 1925 in Texarkana, Texas, to Helen Hoffman Bane and Clyde Linder Bane Sr., he graduated from Texas High School and served in the Army Air Corps from 1944-1946. After graduating from Louisiana Tech University, he married Janice Garmany of Logansport, Louisiana in 1950; together for 59 years until her death in 2009. He worked for Texas Eastern Transmission Corporation for over 30 years, retiring in 1987. Longtime member of Memorial Drive United Methodist Church of Houston and the Bridgebuilder Sunday School class.

Preceded in death by his parents, wife Janice Garmany Bane, sons Clyde L. Bane III and David G. Bane, and brother John M. Bane.
