William Lewis Bryan Page, 66, of Trenton, GA, passed away on Monday, May 31, 2021 in a local hospital.

Bryan was a graduate of Dade County High School and the University of Georgia where he received his master's degree in education. He formerly served as principal of Floral Crest School, was a member of Floral Crest Seventh-day Adventist Church where he served as an elder and was the owner of WSDA radio station. Bryan was a member of the Dade County Ham Radio Club and he recently retired from Trenton Telephone Company where he set up the first 911 system in Dade County. Bryan was a loving husband, dad, brother, uncle and friend and will be missed by all. He was preceded in death by his parents, Walter & Kathleen Warren Page.

Survivors include his wife, Dana Littell Page; sons, Alex & Andrew Page; brother, Barry (Becky) Page; aunt, Mary Ryan; uncle, Johnny (Nita) Warren; several nieces, nephews, & cousins.

Mrs. Elliott had us doing skits, and I remember Bryan coming in the door of the classroom with a white sheet draped over him in his role as the ghost of Hamlet's father. Bryan as ghost said, "Something's rotten in the state of Denmark, and I think it might be me!" That brought the house down.

My daddy went to school with both Walter and Kathleen, and I remember him saying that Walter Page was one of the finest men he knew. I would say the same about Bryan. It was a pleasure to know him and always good to see him.
